A new project organized by NASBHC putting youth in the driver's seat.

Lead a project to help make taking charge of your health easier!

NASBHC is looking for a group of six to eight youth who utilize a school-based health center (SBHC) to actively investigate health literacy, specifically the ability to understand and act upon spoken and written information from your SBHC.

With youth as lead investigators, this project will look at issues of health literacy through your perspective with a first task of naming the project. You will talk with your friends, health providers, teachers, family, and others to observe what is going on and then come together to brainstorm ideas for addressing the issues you have found.

BENEFITS OF PARTICIPATION

- \$200 stipend per person for full participation in the project.
- Opportunity to impact the delivery of health care services.
- Leadership role on a project with national impact.

TIMELINE AND EXPECTATIONS OF PARTICIPANTS

- One to two hour online training session (April)
- Monthly web conferences (April through June/July)
- Eight to ten hours gathering stories and information (late April through May)
- One in-person, full day wrap-up meeting (June/July)
